Annual Meeting: Mark your calendar for Saturday, May 21 at 10:00 am. We'll be holding our Annual Meeting in the Workshop room next to the Art Gallery at Ho'omaluhia Botanical Garden. Following a short business meeting, including reports from the WAG Board and election of officers, we've planned two art activities, followed by a picnic lunch:

- ✓ Let's Paint Together: Groups of four or five will work together to create 4-5 cooperative acrylic paintings. Think round-robin or musical chairs. Each artist will start a painting on the subject of their choice. At the end of the first 5 minutes, we'll pass the painting to the next person in their group who will continue working on the painting for another 5 minutes, and so on until each person has the painting they started and they will have some time to finish it. Should be a lot of fun to see what we come up with. All materials will be provided.
- ✓ Art Chat: After we make art, we'll talk about art. We've planned an informal discussion on tips and techniques for a variety of media. Feel free to bring something you're working on and would like some advice.
- ✓ BYO Picnic: We're not yet allowed to have food in any of the rooms at Ho'omaluhia, so if you
 want to continue to hang out with your fellow artists, plan to bring your lunch and we'll find a nice
 spot if the weather is good.


WAG artists Carol D'Angelo, Dexter Doi, James Hsu, Marina Levy, Betsy Poulos, Madaly Purcell
